Diane is currently a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) for foster children in the San Francisco Bay Area. In the past she has taken on a variety of other community projects. Diane led a task force on alcohol abuse among expatriate teens in Singapore and founded a bereavement support group for young widows and widowers in Florida. Through a companion diocese program of the Episcopal Church in Pennsylvania, she helped lead the launch of community projects in Guatemala among Mayan populations devastated by years of Civil War.
