Victoria is the Co-Founder and President of The Summit Foundation, which was founded in 1991 and provides support for international empowerment of girls and reproductive health initiatives, the conservation of the Mesoamerican Reef ecosystem, and Sustainable Cities. She was a member of the Board of Trustees of the National Gallery of Art from 2000 through 2015. She serves on numerous boards, including Vital Voices Global Partnership, International Center for Research on Women and The Brookings Institution.

Victoria also co-founded and was president of the former Summit Fund of Washington which focused its efforts on improving the health and sustainability of the Anacostia River and preventing teen pregnancy in the District of Columbia. In addition, she is a member of the board of The Phillips Collection, The National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy, Foundation for Art and Preservation in Embassies (FAPE), Kakenya Center for Excellence and S&R Foundation. Victoria completed her term on the Stanford University Board of Trustees in 2007. She is an Emeritus member of The Community Foundation for the National Capital Region. She also serves on numerous advisory councils. She received a Bachelor's degree in History and did graduate work in Speech Pathology and Audiology, both from Stanford University.
